PTSO Meeting Minutes  
Tuesday, December 11, 2007

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 p.m.

Shelly Gagnon ran the meeting as Frank Domanico was out of town. Joan Herrinton was the only other officer there, as Karen Timm had another commitment.

Joan Herrinton gave the treasury report, reporting that the organization had \$1366.80 in the PTSO checking account. She also reported on the sales in the Cougar Store and that the store would have extended hours during the week preceding the holiday vacation.

Mr. Jackson reported on the SIP Committee. They were meeting on December 12, 2007. On their agenda was Cougar Activity Night, assemblies, school security as it pertains to the doors being locked at 7:30 a.m. during the school day.

Mr. Jackson also reported that a couple of students had signed up for the mentoring program. The volunteers are willing to mentor in math, science and Spanish.

Discipline was another topic Mr. Jackson discussed as it pertains to the behavior of the students in the class and halls. Also, that racial comments would not be tolerated at any time at school.

Cougar Activity Night was discussed in great detail. It is scheduled for 1/18/2008, from 6:00 P.M. – 9:00 P.M. Joan Herrinton will be making the tickets to be printed and sold after the break. They will cost \$5.00 per family in advance and \$8.00 per family at the door. The results of the survey that was passed out to the students were that the students wanted to have basketball, swimming, dancing, dance dance revolution, guitar hero, ping pong, wrestling, the fitness center and a staff basketball game.

A discussion took place on how we would be able to tell if a student entering the building that night was a SLE student or not, because not all students have an ID card. Mr. Jackson suggested several questions that we could ask the student, including what teacher they had 5<sup>th</sup> hour, for instance.

The donations for the baskets, volunteers needed and the letter and e-mail to all families to be sent on 1/3/2008, were other topics that were discussed.

Winterfest was the next topic discussed. Ms. Boggs and parents would assist the students in decorating for the dance. There were more than 400 at Homecoming, so they expect that many at Winterfest. Bags would be needed for the students' shoes at the coat racks. The dress code would be "appropriate attire."

The February PTSO meeting would include a discussion regarding the Homecoming Parade for next fall. The middle school parents would be invited to that meeting.
