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Seizure Emergency Care Plan for School/Transportation

1. **Grand Mal Seizure:** Arms and leg jerking, increased secretions in mouth, blue-gray skin color, shallow breathing, loss of bowel and bladder control, sleepy afterward.

Treatment Plan for Grand Mal Seizure:

- A. Provide privacy to student, if possible. Transportation: Pull off to side of road
- B. Notify school office/dispatch to notify parent.
- C. Note time seizure begins and duration of seizure.
- D. Remain with the child.
- E. Transportation: Para educator will begin to remove seat restraints.
- F. If not already on floor, ease child to floor. Seek assistance of other staff to do this safely.
- G. Cushion head with hands or soft items..
- H. Loosen anything tight (i.e. jewelry, clothing).
- I. Turn student on side to prevent choking.
- J. If physician approved for medication, administer medication per physician's order.

NEVER PUT ANYTHING IN THE MOUTH DURING THE SEIZURE.
NEVER HOLD THE CHILD DOWN DURING THE SEIZURE.

If symptoms do not improve within 3 minutes:

(The student's first seizure continues or clusters of seizures occur)

- ◆ Notify school office/transportation office to call parent and EMS/911
- ◆ Use Diastat, if ordered.
- ◆ If transportation to a hospital is necessary after using Diastat, inform EMS to transport to _____.
- ◆ Provide student with reassurance.

****All seizures must be recorded on the district form "Emergency Recording for a Seizure".**
