Nine furniture dealers received bid packages, and three furniture dealers responded. An alternate student chair was selected during the bidding period. KI Inc. provided a quote for \$3,932.00 using direct pricing with a cooperative purchasing contract. Dew-El provided the low bid as specified for a total cost of \$8,331.66. Adagio, who was low bid, submitted all alternate products that were not

equal to the products that were specified.

Elementary Media Center tables to Dew El for \$8,331.66 and approve the award of a PO contract to KI Inc. for the seating at \$3,932.00 as described in the attachments.

Background Information: As part of the work included for Bond 2015, bids were

taken for the Early Childhood Special Ed furniture. The other new ECC classrooms will be equipped with existing preschool furniture that is already in the district. This package was advertised and bids were received on April 28. Six furniture dealers received bid packages, and four furniture dealers responded. There were several small items in this package, and we are recommending splitting the award to the dealers that provided the lowest cost for the items that were as close as possible to what was specified. The three dealers would be Lakeshore Learning at \$1,201.73, School Specialty at \$7,370.05 and Interior Environments at \$10,429.17. The total of the awarded

contracts would be \$19,000.95.
