

Individual student MSTEP score reports are being mailed to families on Wednesday, January 6th. These are results from the MSTEP assessments students took last spring. This information has been provided to our teaching staff as well as parents. The data is one piece of information about a child's progress and we use many pieces of data to make instructional decisions. Proficiency levels change over time and this is only a "snapshot" of where a student was on the day(s) of testing last spring.

Although scores from all schools and districts in the state have dropped somewhat based on this new system of assessments, as a district we are very pleased with our performance. Historically, South Lyon Community Schools have scored high in relation to both Oakland County and the State of Michigan. We are still performing at that same level relative to other districts, with scores near the top of Oakland County.

If a child attended a public school district in Michigan, other than SLCS, during the testing window last spring, parents may contact the student's former school district for further information about his or her scores.

If a child attended SLCS during the testing window last spring, but no longer attends school in our district, parents may contact SLCS to request that the reports be mailed.
