

2021-2022 SLCS Student Screening Guidelines

One of the strategies for reducing the spread of the COVID-19 virus is for people to remain at home if they are experiencing symptoms or if they have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19. The series of questions that asks about an individual's health and possible exposures is called a screener. Students who attend South Lyon Community Schools are strongly encouraged to complete a screener daily before going to school. Parents/guardians are encouraged to administer a screener daily to each of their children attending a SLCS school. The parent/guardian is encouraged administer the screener every day before their student enters the school bus or school building.

Question 1

Has your student tested positive for the COVID-19 virus within the last 10 days? *

If "Yes":

Keep your student home. Consult your healthcare provider. After they have fulfilled the required isolation, your child may return to school after being fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications AND symptoms have improved.

If "No" to all questions, your student may come to school.

Question 2

Is your student currently experiencing ONE or more of the symptoms (listed below) unrelated to a known pre-existing condition (e.g. Asthma, Allergies)? *

New cough

Shortness of breath

Difficulty breathing

New loss of taste or smell

If “Yes”

Keep your student home and isolated for 10 days. Consult your healthcare provider and consider testing for COVID-19. Student can return to school after 10 days if they have been fever free for 24 hrs. (without medications) and symptoms have improved OR if a negative COVID-19 test is provided.

If “No” to all questions, your student may come to school.

Question 3

Is your student currently experiencing TWO or more of the following symptoms (in the description below) unrelated to a known pre-existing condition (e.g. asthma, allergies)? *

Fever (100.4 degrees or greater), Chills , Diarrhea (2x in 24 hours), Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting (2x in 24 hours), Headache, Muscle aches Sore throat, Fatigue

****If experiencing only one of these symptoms, stay home and consult your medical provider. You may return to work/school after being fever free for 24 hours without taking fever reducing medication and symptoms have improved.**

If “Yes”

Keep your student home and isolated for 10 days. Consult your healthcare provider and consider testing for COVID-19. Student can return to school after 10 days if they have been fever free for 24 hrs. (without medications) and symptoms have

If “No” to all questions, your student may come to school.

improved OR if a negative COVID-19 test is provided.

Question 4

Has your child been within 3 feet of a person infected with the COVID-19 virus for a cumulative of 15 minutes or more starting from 2 days before the onset of the COV+ person's symptoms (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before they tested)? *

If "Yes"....

Keep your student home and monitor their health.

NOTE:

- Quarantine for to ten (10) days; OR
- The close contact may return after they quarantine through 7 days if the the following conditions are followed:
 - Five or more days after the exposure date a negative PCR test is produced;
 - Daily symptom/screener checks remain in place for 14 days from the exposure date;
 - Student remains home if they exhibit COVID-19 symptoms;
 - Maintain mitigation strategies such as social distance when possible and frequent hand-washing; AND
 - Family agrees to cooperate with contact tracing efforts by public

If "No" to all questions, your student may come to school.

If your student is identified as a close contact with exposure distance of at least 3 feet, they do not need to quarantine if the following conditions are met:

- Exposure what NOT while eating or during high risk activities;
- Monitoring of symptoms continue;
- Isolation occurs if student develops symptoms;
- Mitigating measures are maintained (mask, social distancing).

*Important Notes:

- If a symptomatic family member is waiting on test results, students should stay home. All household contacts are excluded from work/school while results are pending. If test results are positive or if symptomatic person does not get tested, household contacts are to quarantine for 10 days from last known exposure.
- If your child has tested positive with the COVID-19 virus within three months of the exposure date, they are not required to quarantine.
- If your child has been fully vaccinated for at least 2 weeks they are not required to quarantine.

Consideration 5

If your student has traveled internationally within the last 14 days, continue to monitor their symptoms. *

Student is allowed to come to school, continue to monitor their symptoms.
